#### Education (\$ 39,694.77)

Education is the basic requirement by the community in Jahrkand and Bihar state. Childrens are so motivated to get basic education. Our program by the grace of Allah provides them necessary education which is so much appreciated by local community. Since we have started our program in Jahrkand and Bihar state, hundreds of childrens have received elementary education.

#### An-Noor School

The An-Noor School was started in Kawa Kool in 2008 and is growing rapidly. The school serves 240 children from nursery to grade 4. There is an issue with physical space which CWF is working on.

# Girls School in Topia Village

The girl's boarding school was adopted in 2008 in the village of Topia of Giridih. They are performing very well with 90 girls that live in the boarding house. This year, CWF provided a well system, one bathroom facility for showers, and assistance through the daily food program. CWF also provided sports equipment so girls can have fun.

# Ayub Girls School

CWF arranged special coaching sessions for 9th and 10th grade students in Ayub Girls School. These coaching sessions will help them to perform at a higher level on their board exams in the subjects of Math, Physics, Chemistry and Biology for two months.

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) once had several coins that he asked his wife to distribute in charity. But due to the Prophet's illness at the time, she did not have an opportunity to give out the coins. When the Prophet learned of this, he asked for the coins, placed them in his hand, and then said: "What would God's Prophet think if he were to meet God, who is Great and Glorious, while (still) possessing these?" - Al-Tirmidhi,



















# Alley Nabi School in Khaja Chand Chapra

CWF has been operating in Khaja Chand Chapra Alley Nabi School until becomes self supporting school. After working with the school for 10 years, CWF gave responsibility to local management and moved out in order to focus on other school facilities. In 2010, the school had no monetary liability for the second consecutive year. The school now have around 425 students from KG up to 10th grade.

#### Ameen School in Patna

Ameen School in the heart of Patna has improved its standard of education. CWF supported 100% of its monetary liability in the past. This school have 270 students from KG to 10th grade. This year, the school will have no debt, and the management have decided not to take CWF monetary support in the future.

#### Phuldi School

Phuldi School has been supported by CWF since inception and it is in continual need of monetary help. This boarding school have 35 full time students; CWF supports teacher salaries, food, clothing and all other expenses. This school also provides education to at least 160 students from the surrounding areas. In 2010 the building was completed by providing plaster and white wash.

#### Azad Islamic School in Giridih

CWF supports Azad Islamic Education center in Giridih, which has a full boarding facility. Since inception, CWF continually has helped them meet their liability for cost of operations. This school have 90 boarding students. One full time English teacher and a Qari appointed by CWF.

#### Ishatul-Islam School

Ishatul-Islam School got support from CWF from the begining for its infrastructure and was set up in Bihar Shareef. It has more than 40 boarding students and more than 140 students attend the school from the local community. CWF took the full responsibility of taking care of three students till they memorize the Ouran.



#### Jahrkand and Bihar

Fourty Eight (48) Maktab schools are operating in Jahrkand and Bihar state. CWF takes care of part of salary of all teachers. These schools provide basic education to more than 2,600 students. These are areas where no schools exist and this is the only source of education for the community. CWF also provide books, supporting goods and other necessary supplies to various schools in Bihar and Jahrkand.





Bonuses were awarded to more than 70 teachers from some schools in Jharkand and Bihar state. This surprise helps to improve overall school performance. CWF arranged many training sessions to improve the educational system in most of the areas.

Twelve students were supported in some parts of India for other educational needs. CWF picked good students who belonged to low income families for his/her carrier growth. Vocational (\$7,274.08)

All of CWF run vocational centers are for young girls and women. It was found that in the slums and villages most of the girls either don't go to school or there were no schools in the area. Girls and young women learn skill which they can practice at home and sell the goods in the market to earn extra money.

CWF is helping and managing seven sewing vocational centers for the last few years in Ayub School of Patna, Pakri Barawan, Loha Ka Pul and Batau Kuan in Patna City; and villages in Jana, Asthawan and Kawakool.

These centers provide facility to at least 300 girls per year. In this fiscal year CWF opened two new sewing centers, one in Roh village and another in Khara Kuwan of Patna Bihar. These centers provide facility to at least 60 girls per year.

Two Zari Work centers are also under the supervision of CWF, one in Ayub School and another in Pakri Barawan. This is highly needed skill in the market and these young women can earn a good living by learning this skill. These centers train at least 60 skilled young women every year. This year CWF held a competition in most of the centers and provides a sewing machine to the top student and kitchen utensils to the second and third position girl.

Instructor also receives a monetary gift.

General (\$8,044.15)

A total of 538 blankets were distributed in many areas of Bihar and Jharkhand state during times of extreme cold weather. Also, 433 warm shawls were provided to men and women.

A village in Deen Bandhi area was badly damaged by Fire. CWF helped 300 people with clothing, sleepers, bed sheets, and kitchen utensils and arranged a meal program the next day of Fire.

CWF distributed mangoes to more than 750 kids. These kids do not get to enjoy this fruit often so it was a great treat. Also, more than 75 other families were supported and helped in many villages.

Qurbani Sadaqa (\$23,231.18)

This year, 92 Cattles and 109 goats were for qurbani. This provided meat for more than 6,610 families. This program provided meat to some of the families who wait for the whole year to receive some meat for their families.

Sadaqa of 46 cattles provided meat for more than 2,760 families and sadaqa of 45 goats provided meat to more than 450 families.

Nine big lunch/dinner meals were arranged in many villages and schools. This program fed more than 800 people. People from all backgrounds were welcomed for this one time meal.

# Flood Relief (\$40,000.00):

• Pakistan was hit by a devastating flood in 2010. This was one of the worst flood faced in Pakistani history. Many non profit organizations started working in multiple areas of the country. Right from the beginning of the flood until its after effects, CWF worked in Sind and Baluchistan provinces providing relief.

• During the first phase of the flood, CWF collaborated wit Mother and Child Clinic in Nowshara Khyber Pakhtoon area.

Through the clinic, more than 10,000

people in the area were provided medical and basic support. This included medications, milk, food, water, a propane tank, clothing, household goods, and rations.

• In Thatta Sind, 215 families were supported for one month of groceries. CWF also provided a drinking water plant which served 4,000 people a day for 6 months. The plant costs approximately \$9,000. Now this water system serves water to the Children Cancer and the Afzal Thelesmia hospitals in Karachi. It saves the hospital approximately Rs: 100,000 per year.

• Two houses were completed for two needy families, and 15 more houses are to be built in Dera Ghazi Khan. Also during the winter, 210 blankets were distributed.


• One week of food supply was provided for 114 families in Bhuki, Gara Ramzi and Orh Sharif village of NWFP.

# Marriages (\$4,360.44)

CWF provided the needed supplies and assistance to facilitate marriages of 29 women and young girls in different villages of Bihar and Jharkand state of India.













Abu Hurayrah reported that the prophet S.A.S said, When a person dies, his actions come to an end except in respect to three things that he leaves behind: a continuous charity, beneficial knowledge that helps others, and righteous children who pray for him."

#### Mosque (\$20,769.69)

CWF is continually renovating and building mosques in various parts of Bihar and Jharkhand.

- A new mosque was built in the village of Parwaha Dakhan Tola Deen Bandi. This is a unique mosque built with a very low cost per need of the village. It provides a facility for the villagers to pray 5 times.
- A beautiful mosque named "Hayat Masjid" completed this year in Giridih.
- Another new mosque was built in the village of Nawabganj Sikandra, Bihar. This mosque has the full facility of bathroom, an ablution place, and Imam's residence. An incomplete mosque in Phooldih, Bihar was helped to expand and renovate.
- Two Mosques, one in Bihar Shareef and other in Lohari village were provided with ablution place.
- Two mosques, one in Asthanna, Bihar and another in Radhwa Village of Jahrkand, were provided with bathroom facility.

Housing (\$28,646.95)

CWF built 12 houses, which helped families in various villages of Bihar and Jharkand states. These houses were built for widows and the very needy; these families were not in a position to afford a house. It helped them to settle in one place with their families with peace and tranquility. Six other families were helped to repair their homes. Seventeen houses were provided with a bathroom facility in the various villages of Bihar and Jharkand states. CWF picked families based on the number of adult girls in the family so they did not have to go to the fields for their needs. Seventeen tube wells/hand pumps were also constructed in different villages. Each of the tube well benefits at least 8 people daily.

# Stipend & Food (\$16,826.98)

About 212 families that included widows, elderly or handicaps were helped by quarterly ration program. In the villages, most people are going through a tough financial situation. This ration program facilitates 2 person family basic needs (rice/flour/lintel etc).

Sixty (60) students including 4 orphans were provided basic assistance to thrive in the school. These students are in Deen Bandi School and CWF helps them get breakfast and other basic needs.

#### Ramadan (\$27,354.27)

• A new program started in 2008 to support an entire family from the first day of Ramadan till the Eid celebration. This was a great success. This year it helped 52 families in different parts of Bihar and Jharkand state. This program provided all of the needs of a home. They don't even need to buy salt or matchboxes for that month. It included all grocery for the month and the clothing for the day of Eid (covers six member of family).

Sahoor and Iftar packages were distributed among 707 families. This package contains raw material for iftar and sahoor. These packages were enough for two-person family for the whole month of Ramadan at two meals per day.

• CWF distributed sawai and sugar among 230 families a day before Eid. This way they could celebrate the day of Eid.

More than 850 families received rice and flour from Fitra program. It was distributed in the first 10 days of Ramadan. CWF provided 1,012 women-clothing (Saries etc), 1,392 suits to young girls, 575 men-clothing and more than 310 young children were provided with Eid Clothing.

One full month of iftar program was arranged for more than 40 families. Cooked meals were given to the families who were fasting and having tough time to get proper food to break the fast. Also, thirteen iftar meals were arranged in different villages that provided a good meal for more than 4,550 people.

Animal Sadaqas were done (8 Cattle and 7 Goats) a day before Eid to provide meat to the families which usually don't get meat. An Eid festival was arranged in Kawakool, Phuldi village of Bihar; and Topia village of Jharkand. It made an Eid day a big day of celebration for at least 2,000 children. It provided some activity and free food for those children who were unable to celebrate the Eid day. At least 90 families were given some monetary support few days before

Eid to cover some miscellaneous needs prior to Eid.

# Medical (\$ 1,17,201.21) INDIA medical projects:

- CWF provided a Cardiac Monitor to the MSM hospital facility. This helps doctors to monitor their patients during surgeries. A refrigerator was also provided in the Pathology Lab of MSM hospital. It helps the hospital by protecting and keeping immunization medicines and other items at a proper temperature.
- CWFs eye surgery program is one of the longest running and successful programs. In 2010, the MSM hospital conducted 385 eye surgeries. Out of those 294 surgeries were conducted free of cost and were sponsored by CWF. The remaining surgery cost brought in significant funds to the operational funds of the hospital.
- CWF started sponsoring Hydraulic Surgery. In 2010, the MSM hospital conducted 7 free surgeries on behalf of CWF. The average cost of each surgery was \$22 per patient. Also CWF is continuously helping MSM Hospital to provide vitamins and other medicine for Tuberculosis patients in Phulwari Shareef area. The extreme level of poverty does not allow people of this region to have good nutrition. The vitamins and medicine allows the number of patients to be reduced at the hospital.
- CWF arranged medical camps in Kawakool Nawadah and Patna City. These camps provide basic medical support and eye checkups for more than 550 patients.
- The Clinic in Patna city, which was started in December of 2006, has taken care of 8,799 patients in 2010 at a cost of 85 cents per patient. This clinic has a good lab facility and provides basic medication to all patients. Eye check-up are also done two days a week at this facility.
- The clinic in Sabzi Bagh of Patan was started in June of 2008. This clinic has taken care of 8,165 patients at a cost of \$1.33 per patient. The clinic has a lab, an X-ray, and ultrasound facility; it also provides basic medication to patients. A regular eye specialist comes to the clinic three days a week.















A'ishah reported: "Once a man said to the prophet S.A.S,'My mother suddenly died, and I believe that, she lived longer, she would have given something is charity. • Camps for Hepatitis-B and Tetanus Immunization were arranged in Tikodih, Radhwa, Nematullah Dhamni, Lal Pure and Hassan Pure of Nawada district. A total of 1,170 Tetanus and Hepatitis-B were given to children.

# PAKISTAN medical projects:

- CWF provided a third ambulance to the Children Cancer Foundation. Treatment for cancer and Thallassemia is extremely expensive and no single organization or hospital can afford the cost alone. CWF is trying to fulfill some of the needs of a few of the curable patients; 10+ patients were successfully treated and others are in the process of treatment under this program in 2010.
- CWF adopted a few Thallassemia patients and pay for full cost of their medical treatment.
- CWF provided a Platelet Agitator machine to the Children Cancer Hospital.
- CWF is sponsoring four permanent clinics in suburbs of Karachi; Sachal Goth, Lasi Para, Goth Dhani Baksh and new one started in August 2010 at Kamran Chorongi. These clinics together provided healthcare to 43,780 patients at a cost of 59 cents per patient in 2010. All of these clinics provide 95% of all medication free of cost to their patients.

# Business (\$ 1,222.03)

Charity Way Foundation seeks to help families become self sustained and earn their own living. CWF has done by providing three families with vegetable and fruit carts, two individuals with sewing machines. CWF also aided two families in starting their own business in buying and selling cattle, a family to start a seafood business, a family to expand their business of scraps and another two families in starting a meat business.










