Charity Way Foundation in its last **seventeen** years of journey while working in India and Pakistan has found that there is a great need of attention to help people in these countries. CWF presently works in the two states of India namely Bihar and Jharkhand and Karachi in Pakistan. Alhamdulillah its intervention has helped transform lives of thousands of people in these places. It has successfully implemented a number of projects in the areas of health care, education, housing, safe drinking water, vocational training and livelihood.

## Health Care (\$84,549.03):

### India

Charity Way Foundation's eye surgery program is one of the longest running and successful programs. In 2015, CWF conducted **799** eye surgeries. All these surgeries are free of cost for all patients.

CWF arranged **12** Medical camps in the villages of Bihar. These camps are established specially for eye checkups for more than **6,000** patients.

The Clinic in Patna City, which was started in December of 2006, has taken care of more than **4000** patients in 2015 at a cost of **\$2** per patient. This clinic has a good lab facility and provides basic medication to all patients.

A new clinic which was started from Dec 2012 at Hajiganj in suburb of Patna has taken care of more than **2000** patients in 2015 at a cost of **\$3** per patient.

Camps for Hepatitis-B and Tetanus Immunization were arranged in Bihar. A total of **1,427** Tetanus and Hepatitis-B vaccines were given to adults and children.

More than **35** other patients were helped in the form of surgeries (Appendix, Child birth, Hernia, Trauma) and medication in villages and towns of Jharkhand and Bihar.

### Pakistan

CWF is sponsoring four permanent clinics in suburbs of Karachi, Sachal Goth, Lasi Para, Goth Dhani Bakhsh and at Kamran Chaurangi. These clinics together provided healthcare to more than **55,000** patients at a cost of less than 98 cents per patient in 2015. All of these clinics provide 95% of all medication free of cost to their patients. We have started working to provide remote Lab services to our patients.

Treatment for Cancer and Thalassemia is extremely expensive and no single organization or hospital can afford the cost alone. CWF is continually helping and taking care of adult Cancer and children Thalassemia patients.

In the year of 2015, CWF took care of **2** Dialysis patients for the full year.



## Education (\$43,833.59):

An-Noor English School started in 2008 in Kawakol is one of the best Schools in Nawada district of Bihar. The school serves more than **500** students from nursery to grade 7 served by a team of dedicated teachers. It caters to a large number of villages of Kawakol block. The first school van was purchased in 2014 and another one was purchased on demand of parents in 2015. The transport facility strengthened the number of students in the school. School has two electric water coolers to provide safe drinking water to the students of the school. School nurtures scholastic as well as non-scholastic abilities of its students resulting into quality education

Two Rahbar Coaching Centers are fully sponsored by CWF. Rahbar coaching centers are free tuition centers conceived by "Bihar Anjuman". It aims to provide the best education to the students belonging to marginalized sections among Muslim community. It enrolls students of class 8, 9 and 10 admitted in government schools. Presently there are 80 students at Nawada center and 102 students at Hajipur center. Right from beginning students of these centers proved themselves by achieving about 100% result in grade 10 board examination. In 2015, **100%** students passed board examination at both the centers. Pleasantly all students of Nawada centre passed with first division.

CWF started working and collaborating with 'Rahmani-30' since 2011 which is a unique organization in Bihar. It prepares class 10 young and bright Muslim boys for the prestigious Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) free of cost. It has started girls' Medical entrance program free of cost as well. CWF provided scholarship in the form of loan to **2** of its students. To support in infrastructure it has provided generator and water geezers to the institution. Phuldih School has been supported by CWF since its inception in 1998 and

CWF is in continually working with them. This boarding school has **35** full time students; CWF supports teacher salaries, food, clothing and all other expenses. This school also provides education to at least **160** students from surrounding areas.

CWF supports Azad Islamic Education center in Giridih, which has a full boarding facility. Since inception, CWF continually has helped them meet their deficit for cost of operations. This school has **60** boarding students. One full time English teacher is appointed by CWF.

Two orphan students of Ishatul Islam School in Bihar Sharif is fully supported by CWF. It includes boarding, lodging and all other major and minor expenses. This school is also provided with a teacher to teach local non boarding **160** students.

Forty Eight (**48**) Maktab schools are operating in Jharkhand and Bihar states. CWF takes care of the salary of all teachers of these maktab. These schools provide basic education to more than **2,600** students. They are located in areas where no proper education facility is available and maktab becomes the only source of education for them. CWF also supplied books, supporting goods and other necessary supplies to various schools in Bihar and Jharkhand.

Bonus was awarded to **85+** teachers and other staff members of schools in Jharkhand and Bihar state. This surprise helps to improve overall school performance. CWF arranged many training sessions to improve the educational system in most of the areas.

**6** students who were provided loan scholarships in previous years have started their professional career in the field of engineering and management.





### Ramadan & Eid (\$75,487.37):

In 2015 CWF started a new project of distribution of Ice to enjoy the breaking of fast with cold soothing iced water in the hot summer month of Ramadan. Alhamdulillah it benefited more than **1500** families for the whole month of Ramadan.

The successful Ramadan Package Program started in 2008 to support an entire family from the first day of Ramadan till the Eid celebration continued in 2015. This year it helped **159** families in different parts of Bihar and Jharkhand state. This program provides all of the needs of a home. Such families don't even need to buy salt or matchboxes for that month. It includes entire grocery for the month and it also includes new clothing for the day of Eid. It covers average four to six members of a family.

Sahoor and Iftar packages were distributed among **1278** families. This package contains raw materials for iftar and sahoor. These packages were enough for two-person family for the whole month of Ramadan at two meals per day.

CWF distributed a Chicken, Sewai, Milk and Sugar among **1064** families a day before Eid. This way families could celebrate the day of Eid. CWF added chicken from 2011 to this program where other meat is not possible to deliver.

More than **1700** families received rice and flour from Fitra program. It was distributed in the first 10 days of Ramadan. CWF provided **1824** women-clothing (Saries etc.), **2348** suits to young girls, 664 men-clothing and more than **1032** young children were provided Eid Clothing.

One full month of iftar program was arranged for more than **20** families. Cooked meals were given to the families who were fasting and having tough time to get proper food to break the fast. Also, **16** iftar big meals were arranged in different villages that provided a good meal for more than **5,800** people.

Animal Sadaqas were done (includes Cattle and Goats) a day before Eid to provide meat to the families which usually don't get meat.

Eid fairs were arranged in the villages of Kawakol, Phuldih, Radhwa, Hasanpur, Lalpur and Najalli Bigha in Nawada district of Bihar. It has made Eid day a big day of celebration for minimum **5,100** children. It provides some activity and free food for those children who are unable to celebrate the Eid day due to limited meals.

More than **125** families were given some monetary support few days before Eid to cover some miscellaneous needs prior to Eid.

### Qurbani & Sadaqa (\$50,113.57):

This year, **153** Cattle and **185** goats were offered for qurbani. This provided meat to approximately **7,970** families. This program provides meat to some of the families who wait for the whole year to receive some meat for their families.

Sadaqa of **68** cattle provided meat for more than **6,800** families and sadaqa of **44** goats provided meat for more than **440** families.

Five big lunch/dinner meals were arranged in at Deen Bandhi village School. This program fed more than **500** students and Staff.

**2** Goats were done for Aqiqa.

### Housing (\$29,602.37):

Housing, water and bathroom facilities are huge challenges for families who are already going through hardship of three times meal. In 2015 CWF attempted it for few families:

Nine (**9**) concrete houses were built in the villages of Kawakol, Nematullah Dhamni, Hasanpur, Mohni, Parariya, Roh, Bijho, Radhwa, Jogachak and Gangan Diwan. All these houses have minimum **2** bed rooms; one bathroom, kitchen and hand pump for water.

Helped to complete three partially built house in the village of Phuldih, Baksauti and Deen Bandhi.

Build a room for an Imam next to mosque in the village of Radhwa.





Water and specially drinking water is a huge challenge in villages. This year **11** Hand Pumps installed in Bihar and Jharkhand.

Eleven (**11**) bathroom facilities were built in Radhwa, Hargawan and Baluahi. CWF always facilitate bathroom for families who have more adult girls.

Multiple Houses, Hand pumps were also repaired and renovated in multiple villages.

#### Stipend & Food (\$6,754.54):

This program of CWF provides very basic needs, which is very much needed in the remote areas of India.

In the villages, most people are going through a tough financial situation. This ration program facilitates **2** person family basic needs (rice/flour/lintel etc).

CWF supported around **400** families in 2015. This support included widows, elderly and physically challenged by quarterly ration program.

Forty (**40**) students including **5** orphans are provided basic assistance to thrive in the school. These students are in Deen Bandhi School and CWF helps them get breakfast and other basic needs.

#### Mosque (\$1,637.08):

A new Mosque in Saraiya Village in North Bihar was built. The villagers were waiting from quite a few years for this mosque. In 2015 this dream comes true for them.

Two of the Mosques were provided with Generator facility, one in Jogachak and other in Sabalbigha of Bihar state. Theses Generators help the people in month of summer and especially in the hot summer month of Ramadan.



#### Vocational Training (\$4,421.13):

CWF is proud of this project of building skills for young girls and women in slums and villages of India. The challenge for adult girls and women is to engage in activities which can help them in their own life. These great skills make them confident and also promotes earning some good money which is helping them and their whole family.

We appreciate our instructors and teachers for their work through bonuses and Eid gifts. This is unusual and surprising for them.

CWF is continually upgrading and managing **10** sewing & stitching vocational centers for the last few years in Loha Ka Pul, Batao Kuan, Khara Kuan of Patna; also villages in Jana, Asthawan, Roh, Kawakol and two in Pakri Barawan and 1 in Baghadih in Jharkhand. These centers produce minimum of **360** young girls and women per year. **1** embroidery work center is also running at Pakri Barawan. It generates nice Zari products and descent income for trainees.

#### Marriages (\$7,737.43):

CWF provided the needed supplies and assistance to facilitate marriages of **49** women and young girls in different villages of Bihar and Jharkhand state of India.

#### Business (\$1,725.48):

CWF had provided loan to multiple families for small businesses like grocery shop, cattle and goat business, clothing business, sewing machine to start tailoring work, vegetable and fruit business.

CWF dream project of Bag factory is continually running, it was started in 2011. It started with **30** individuals, now this industry engaged minimum of **72** individuals, **65** women and **7** men of Kawakol in Nawada district of Bihar is working for it. Ladies use to make INR **40** to **50** per day by cutting woods in the jungle. Now they are securely working from their home and making INR 100 to 175 per day.





### General (\$18,877.07):

A total of **3,300** blankets were distributed in different areas of Bihar and Jharkhand states during times of extreme cold weather conditions.

CWF distributed mangoes to more than **300** families. These families do not get to enjoy this fruit often so it was a great treat for them.

A big Lunch provided in the village of Hargawan of Bihar, it served **715** people.

Few families were helped with minor cash to get some urgent items for their families.

As widow I had no money for surgery of gall bladder. Charity Way Foundation had earlier constructed my house. Therefore I was hesitant to request for another support but support came to me and now I am alive. Those who helped me in pain are my father and mother. May Allah grant his best support to my benefactors.

The family I belong to has limited knowledge and means for higher education. No one in my family even passed matriculation examination but I dreamt to become an engineer. #### Mushtari Khatoon, Rasul Nagar, Nawada- Blanket

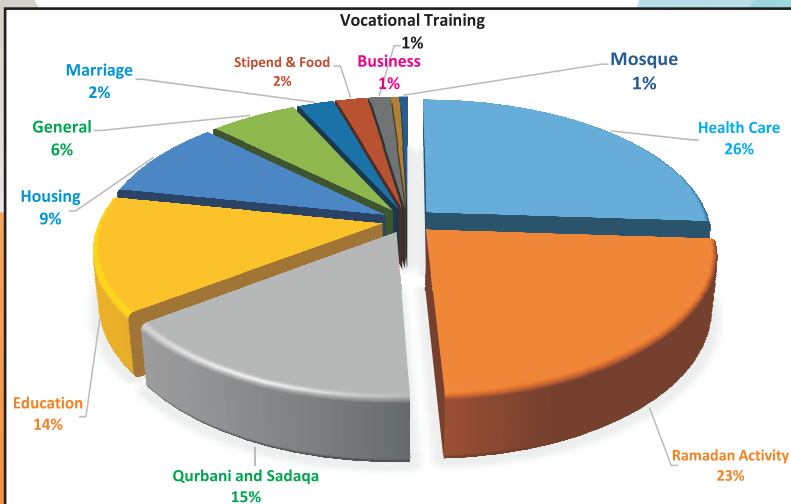
