CHARITY WAY FOUNDATION

Charity Way Foundation (CWF) was established in the year 1999 in the United States as a 501 (c) (3) U.S. tax exempt organization. In the last **24 years** of its existence, it has successfully served one of the most poverty stricken population in India and Pakistan. In this duration, it reached out to hundreds of thousands of families in Bihar, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Telangana states in India and Sindh in Pakistan. Healthcare, Education, Food, Clothing, Housing, Toilet, Drinking Water, Vocational Training, Marriage Assistance, Small Business, Winter Clothes distribution are focus areas of the organization.

FLOOD RELIEF IN PAKISTAN (\$11,366.11)

In 2022, a devastating flood in Pakistan caused a great deal of destruction and hardship. In response, the CWF helped to distribute rations to over **200** families for two months and **750** blankets during the winter. Additionally, **100** ration packages are in the process of being distributed in interior Sindh. This was done to ensure that those in need had access to food and other essential items.





HEALTH CARE (\$187,145.04)

We at CWF put efforts to restore loss of vision of people living in villages of India due to cataract. In addition to it, other ailments where surgeries are needed are also taken care of. In Pakistan, the major program is care for thalassemia patients. Other projects include mammograms and dialysis of patients. Medical clinics are operated in both these countries which take care of a large number of patients.

INDIA

Cataract eye surgery is one of the oldest and successful programs of the foundation in India. Since a large number of people lose their eyesight due to negligence and financial constraints, we organize free health check-up camps and cataract eye surgeries in the villages of Bihar. In 2022, we organized **14** health check-up camps in the villages of Andharbari, Roh, Maskor, Sirdala Baksauti, Haldia, Madhobigha, Rasul Nagar, Akbarpur, Dhamaul in Nawada district and Bihar Sharif in Nalanda district attended by more than **4,100** people. It resulted in the cataract surgeries of more than **645** patients of age range of 14 to 75 years with all free facilities which includes cost of surgery, blood examination, medicines, spectacles, and meals during stay in the hospital.

In Patna City, Bihar a medical clinic by the name of Shifa Health Centre has been successfully running since 2006 to provide basic medical care to the population living in the surrounding area. This year, more than **7,000** patients were treated at the cost of **\$0.96** per patient with free basic medications.

The hepatitis-B vaccination program has been extremely successful in reaching out to **472** children in Phuldeeh, Baksauti and Bihar Sharif. It has enabled these children to lead healthier lives, as they are now protected from the potentially fatal virus. Furthermore, the Madarsa Ishaat Islam's **22** students have been supported with eye tests, medicines, and spectacles. This has given these students the opportunity to achieve better vision and to pursue their educational

goals. This program has been instrumental in improving the lives of these children and students.

In Khatna (circumcision for boys), **268** children were covered with complete medication that includes tetanus injection in Rasul Nagar, Nawada.

Other surgery assistance and medical support were provided to more than **10** patients in the states of Bihar and Jharkhand.

PAKISTAN

The ZMT Clinic network in Karachi, sponsored by CWF, provides a range of facilities including laboratories and pharmacies. In the year 2022, the four clinics (Lasi Para, Sachal Goth, Dhani Bux and Kamran Chaurangi) administered a total of **124,558** patients, at an approximate cost of **\$0.41** per patient. These clinics provide an essential service to the local community and are invaluable in providing quality healthcare to those who may not otherwise be able to access it.

The AMTF Hospital managed a total of **2,676** patients in 2022, with a focus on dialysis and general patients. Chemotherapy and medication supply for cancer patients was continuously provided by AMTF in collaboration with Liaquat Hospital, supported by CWF, managing a total of **12** patients. CWF also donated a mammogram machine to the AMTF hospital to help with early detection of breast cancer. Additionally, CWF provided partial salary funding for **2** employees at the hospital. Blood transfusions are an ongoing support for thalassemia patients, and CWF actively works with AMTF in this area.

CWF is working with the SSWAB Trust in Karachi to help prevent kidney failure through Dialysis treatment and education on how to prevent the disease through controlling Diabetes and Hypertension. The Trust is also supported by CWF to provide follow-up care for those who have already been affected by kidney failure and are undergoing Dialysis.



EDUCATION (\$67,316.09)

We, at CWF strongly believe that education empowers people and improves chances of life success. With this thought we are running schools, supporting maktab and motivating teachers to perform efficiently.

An-Noor English School at Kawakol in the Nawada district of Bihar was established in 2008 for modern education to the financially challenged neighborhood population. Bringing high quality education in a village is an uphill task due to challenges in resource mobilization. With an enrolment of more than **300** students with **13** staff this school runs from **Playgroup** to **grade 8**. It has a computer and projector used by teachers and students for learning different subjects.

This year a science fair was organized in the school which was a grand success in which children put their science exhibits and food stalls. It was attended by the senior scientist from agriculture science center, Nawada who appreciated the efforts of children and teachers. More than **200** parents also visited the science fair.

In the campus of the school, a free coaching program sponsored by CWF is running since 2012 by the name of Rahbar Coaching Centre for grade **8** to **10** students admitted in the government schools. It promotes education to mainly girl students who dropout from schools due to financial and social reasons. Total enrolment in this center is **80** with a team of **5** teachers. This year **14** students have appeared in the Grade **10** board examination.

An-Noor Coaching established in Nawada in 2021 continued with **160** students of Grade **8** to **10** who showed excellent performances. A new initiative named An-Noor Super Classes, a completely free coaching, lodging and boarding program for admission in professional courses in reputed universities started. All **10** students admitted to this program succeeded in various competitive examinations of renowned university Jamia Millia Islamia and Rahmani Program of Excellence for IIT-JEE preparation. A free lodging facility for **6** students in New Delhi was developed for



successful students of **An-Noor Super Classes** admitted in Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi.

In 1998, a free boarding school named Madarsa Islamia Darul Falah was established in the village of Phuldeeh which gets support from CWF. Presently **23** students are boarding in this school. Teachers' salary, food, clothing and all other expenses are supported by CWF. It provides education to more than **120** students of the nearby areas who attend shorter duration classes every day. To encourage students, high performing students were awarded in this school.

In another school named Madarsa Ishatul-Islam in Bihar Sharif, **2** orphan students are fully supported by CWF. It includes boarding, lodging and all other major and minor expenses. This school is also provided with a teacher to teach about **160** local students.

Another school based at Masjid Hayat in Giridih is supported by us having **18** boarders, **1** teacher and **1** cook. These students are also admitted to the school for contemporary education.

In Ashraf Jahan Complex at Village Topia, Giridih we are organizing maktab for **250** students of the neighborhood. We are supporting other **22** Maktab schools in Jharkhand and **13** in Bihar by taking care of part of teachers' salary. These schools are located in remote areas of minimal educational facilities as a result of which these institutions become the only source of education for children. These schools provide basic education to more than **4,000** students.

We supported **10** students with educational expenses like admission, tuition fee and books in various institutions.

CWF also supplied books, supporting goods and other necessary supplies to various schools in Bihar and Jharkhand.

In 2022, bonus was awarded to more than **85** teachers and other staff of schools in Jharkhand and Bihar states. This incentive encourages them to improve overall school performance.





QURBANI-SADAQA (\$99,514.32)

This year, **260** Cattle and **200** Goats were offered for Qurbani. This provided meat to more than **12,500** families. This program provides meat to some of the families who wait for the whole year to receive some meat for their families.

Sadaqa of **81** cattle provided meat for more than **3,240** families and sadaqa of **74** goats provided meat for more than **888** families.

CWF expanded their Qurbani project in the suburbs of Karachi, providing **25** cattle and **5** goats for Udhiya (sacrifice). This project benefited more than **100** families, providing them the chance to eat meat for the first time this year.

STIPEND FOOD (\$56,901.36)

CWF provided monthly basic rations to **310** families in Bihar and Jharkhand on a monthly basis, mostly consisting of widows and elderly people. Additionally, a few other families were provided with pensions to cover their basic daily expenses. This was done to ensure that these families had access to the necessary resources to survive and to provide them with a sense of security and stability. The rations provided included food items such as rice & wheat.

Besides the above, **347** families were helped by an extended ration program on a one-time basis.



HOUSING & WATER (\$25,123.39)

In Bihar and Jharkhand, **4** houses were built, **3** in Bihar and **1** in Jharkhand. Additionally, a loan was provided to a family to build a home. To protect the girls in the families from any mishap, **4** bathrooms were provided in the homes. Furthermore, **10** hand pumps were installed in the houses to provide clean and fresh water supply, thus saving the hardship of going out and bringing water.

In West Bengal, a deep boring of 250 feet with a submersible was done for the benefit of a few families, a madrasa, and a masjid. This allowed them to access clean and fresh water, which was a great boon for the community.

Additionally, a water cooler system was installed in An-Noor English School in Kawakol, Nawada. This system benefited more than **300** students, providing them with access to clean and fresh water every day.





RAMADAN & EID (\$154,919.20)

CWF organizes many programs in the holy month of Ramadan. It promotes the value of care and wellbeing for the underprivileged brothers and sisters.

In the hot summer month of Ramadan free ice distribution was started in the year 2015. It helps people to break their fast with cold soothing water. In 2022 it reached more than **1,180** families for the full month of Ramadan.

The Ramadan package program was started in the year 2008 which supports the entire family from the first day of Ramadan till Eid celebration. This program provides all the household needs during Ramadan. Such families don't need to buy even salt or matchboxes for that month. It also includes grocery for the month and the clothing for the day of Eid for an average family of six members. This year it helped **230** families in different parts of Bihar, Jharkhand and Uttarakhand

CWF distributed Sahoor and Iftar packages to **4,825** families during Ramadan. These packages contain raw materials for iftar and sahoor and were enough for a two-person family for the entire month of Ramadan at two meals per day. The packages included items such as rice, oil, sugar, lentils, dates and one-person clothing. The packages were intended to help families in need have enough food to break their fast and have a wholesome meal during the holy month.

CWF provided both Eid packages and animal Sadaqa (animal sacrifice) to families in need a day before Eid, it includes **1,300** families. These packages contained chicken, lachcha (a type of item to make sweet), milk and sugar, and were intended to help families in need celebrate Eid as a festival. The packages provided families with enough food to make a festive meal for Eid, and to break their fast in a special way. Some families received Goat/Cattle meat by Sadaqa (animal sacrifice) to **295** families who usually don't get a sumptuous meal.

CWF also ran a Fitra program during Ramadan, providing more than **500** families with rice and wheat during the first **10** days of the month.

CWF also provided **8** big meals during Ramadan, reaching more than **4,500** people. These meals contained delicacies such as pulao, gosht or biryani, and zarda, and were intended to help people break their fast with a special and wholesome meal.

CWF organized Eid fairs in the villages of Kawakol, Phuldeeh, Radhwa, and Hasanpur in the Nawada district of Bihar. These fairs provided more than **5,300** children with a fun and festive Eid day, with treats such as golgappe (a type of fried snack), chole (a type of chana curry), ice-cream, and toys. The fairs allowed children who were unable to celebrate Eid in a special way to enjoy the day and make it a memorable experience.

CWF provided more than **250** families with some monetary support a few days before Eid. This was done at the special request of donors and was intended to help families cover miscellaneous needs prior to the Eid holiday.

MOSQUE (\$8,674.66)

In Sonapur Garhwa, a village in the Supaul District of Bihar, a mosque was built. This mosque provides a facility for the five daily prayers and also a small madrasa which provides basic education to the younger generations. This mosque has been a great blessing for the villagers, as it has allowed them to practice their faith and to pass on their knowledge to the next generation. The mosque has been a source of great pride and joy for the community.





VOCATIONAL TRAINING (\$6,225.72)

The CWF runs **11** Vocational Centers to teach cutting and stitching clothes. This skill provides young girls and women with the opportunity to start small businesses in their villages and to help their families financially. More than **200** students graduate every year from these centers, and upon graduation, they are provided with machines to start their profession and to help their families. This has been a great blessing for the people in these areas, as it has allowed them to have access to more opportunities and to be able to help families.

MARRIAGE (\$468.21)

CWF helped to perform **3** marriages and to purchase home basic items for the girls of the villages of Pakribarawan, Bijho, and Pahadpur in Bihar. This was done to ensure that the girls had the necessary items to start their new lives and to provide them with a sense of security and stability.

BUSINESS (\$12,067.05)

In Jharkhand, a commercial silai machine and interlock machine were provided to help expand tailoring businesses. In Bihar, assistance was given to start a small grocery business. Additionally, support was provided to expand businesses related to clothing and other items. This allowed the people in these areas to have access to more opportunities and to be able to make a living. The support provided to these businesses was invaluable and helped to improve the lives of many people.

The Bag making business has been extremely successful, it started in 2011. It has not only provided employment to **25** women but has also helped them to become financially independent. These women are now able to support their

families, as each woman earns an average of INR **3,000** per month. This business has improved the quality of life of these women and has enabled them to become productive members of society.

A new project initiated this year of 2022 with the collaboration of Tooba Foundation, Micro Financing. This initiative has been extremely successful in helping 47 families in Karachi, Pakistan. By providing them with small loans, it has enabled them to expand their businesses or fulfill urgent needs. This program has been instrumental in improving the lives of these families, as it has given them the opportunity to become more financially independent and to pursue their dreams.

GENERAL (\$31,974.40)

Winter items like blankets and chadars were distributed to **2,026** families in Sabal Bigha (District Jamui, Bihar), Dhaba kendra (District Giridih, Jharkhand), Phuphandi Eidgah more (District Jamtara, Jharkhand), Baryabigha, Datrol, Mohammadpur, Aman Mohalla, Sabzi farosh Tola, Dhamaul, Padariya, Turkban, Dastalli Bigha, Pakribarawan (District Nawada, Bihar).

This initiative has been extremely successful in helping physically challenged persons in the Nawada district. By providing them with **4** hand rickshaws (wheelchairs), it has enabled these persons to move around more freely and to live their lives with more independence. This initiative has been instrumental in improving the lives of these persons and has enabled them to lead better lives.

This initiative has been incredibly successful in reaching out to **1,000** families in **20** villages and students of the Phuldeeh Madarsa School and An-Noor Super classes. By providing them with **1,522** kilograms of mangoes, it has enabled them to have access to nutritious food during the summer season.

Volunteers who work tirelessly for the organization were given gifts.
